

INCLUSION AND EXCLUSION CRITERIA FOR OPTIONAL ADD-ONS

Important Disclaimer: The following tests are for screening purposes only and are not intended to be diagnostic. These tests are designed to be used by individuals who want to be proactive about their health and should be interpreted in conjunction with other clinical findings and by a qualified physician.

SPOT-MAS™ test

Who is this test for?

This test is recommended for individuals who meet one of the following criteria:

- **Preventive screening considerations:** Participants aged 40 and above with no suspected signs of cancer and who have not been previously diagnosed with cancer
- **High-risk factors:** Individuals with a history of heavy smoking, heavy alcohol consumption, Hepatitis B or C infection, known inherited cancer mutations, or a family history of cancer

Who should not take this test?

This test is **not recommended** for patients who:

- Were diagnosed with cancer within the last 5 years, or those with highly suspected signs of cancer
- Have breast or thyroid lesions with a BI-RADS/TI-RADS score of 5 or greater
- Have lung or liver lesions with a LUNG-RADS/LI-RADS score of 4 or greater
- Have polyps measuring 1 cm or larger, or unusual growths or ulcers found during a digestive endoscopy that may require further medical follow-up
- Are pregnant
- Have undergone a bone marrow transplant or whole blood transfusion within the last 3 months

Limitations of the SPOT-MAS test

- A **positive result** (ctDNA signal detected) does not definitively confirm the presence of cancer. Certain other medical conditions can also produce a positive result
- A **negative result** (no ctDNA signal detected) does not completely rule out the possibility of cancer. This can be due to several reasons, including the tumor type being outside the scope of the test, the tumor's location, or specific genetic characteristics of the cancer

LucenceINSIGHT™ 50 test

Who is this test for?

This test is recommended for patients who are:

- Aged 40 and above, OR
- Have an elevated risk of cancer due to family history, diet, or lifestyle

Who should not take this test?

This test is **not recommended** for patients who:

- Are pregnant
- Are in cancer remission for less than 3 years
- Have had surgery, an allogeneic bone transplant, or a blood transfusion less than 2 weeks before the sample collection

Important considerations for LucenceINSIGHT™ 50

- This test does not assess inherited cancer risk, and genetic counseling is not required
- This is not a diagnostic test. Positive results require follow-up testing and consultation with a physician
- This test should be used to complement, not replace, routine cancer screenings
- The test only detects the cancers listed in its panel. Other cancers may still be present
- Brain tumors are not included in this test panel due to the biological limitations of detecting their signals in the blood
- Both false positive and false negative results can occur. Annual testing is recommended for ongoing monitoring
